Timothy's Duties As An Evangelist As Set Forth In Second Timothy

Chapter One:

1. Stir up his gift (v. 6).
2. Be not ashamed of the testimony of Christ nor of Paul His prisoner (v. 8).
3. Hold fast the form of sound words (v. 13).
4. Keep the good thing committed to him (v. 14).

Chapter Two:

1. Be strong in the grace of Christ Jesus (v. 1).
2. Teach faithful men (v. 2).
3. Endure hardness as a good soldier (vv. 3,4)
4. Strive lawfully (v. 5).
5. Consider what Paul said (v. 7).
6. Put the brethren in remembrance (vv. 11-14).
7. Show himself approved as a workman of Christ (vv. 15-18).
8. Make himself a vessel unto honour and meet for the master's use (vv. 20-22)
9. Avoid foolish questions (v. 23).
10. To be gentle in teaching (vv. 24-26).

Chapter Three:

1. Warn concerning perilous times (vv. 1-9).
2. Use Paul as an example (vv. 10-15)
3. The inspired word of God would furnish him to every good work (vv. 16,17).

Chapter Four:

1. Preach the word (vv. 1-5).
